Its called the Five Oaks Promise and is part of an initiative call Dayton a Place to Call Home. The initial research done by Wright State grad students looks promising.

At our last meeting we introduce the City's new housing manager, **Max Fuller** to Five Oaks. It was a productive and informative meeting. Max spoke about the planned demolition in Five Oaks and the City of Dayton. The City plans to remove 1000 obsolete units of housing with federal NSP funds and has the money in hand. FONIA has placed over 50 properties on our demo 'wish list'.

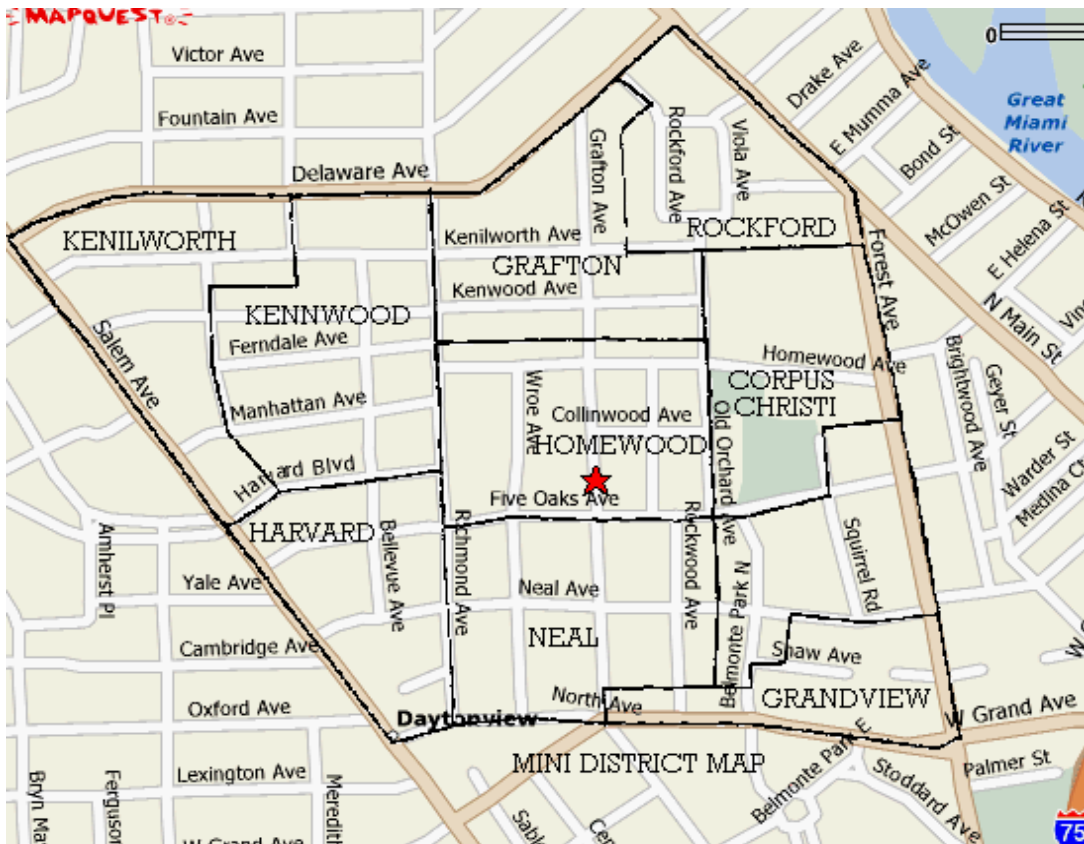

- Briefly describe the suspect: sex and race, age, height, weight, hair color, clothing, distinctive characteristics such as beard, mustache, scars, or accent.
- Describe the vehicle if one was involved: color, make, model, year, license plate, and special features such as stickers.
